

LITURGICAL ART NOTES

The Holy Trinity

The cover design features some of the oldest symbols of the Holy Trinity. The three fishes represent the fact that all Three Persons of the Trinity have a part in our salvation: the love of the Father, the sacrifice of the Son and the work of the Holy Spirit. Three fishes pictured together also signify the Holy Trinity's action through the waters of baptism. The triangle is one of the oldest Trinity symbols. The three equal and distinct sides express the equality of the three distinct persons while their union results in but one figure. It is combined with the trefoil or three connecting circles which represents the eternal nature of the Triune God.

FIRST READING Proverbs 8:1-4, 22-31

In the Bible, wisdom is portrayed in terms sometimes human and sometimes divine. Often, wisdom is personified as feminine. In this passage, Woman Wisdom is depicted not only as the first creation of God, but also as God's helper, rejoicing in God's creation, especially in human beings.

A reading from Proverbs:

Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice?

On the heights, beside the way, at the crossroads she takes her stand;
beside the gates in front of the town, at the entrance of the portals she cries out:
“To you, O people, I call, and my cry is to all that live.

The LORD created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago.
Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth.
When there were no depths I was brought forth,
when there were no springs abounding with water.
Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth—
when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil.
When he established the heavens, I was there,
when he drew a circle on the face of the deep,
when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep,
when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his
command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth,
then I was beside him, like a master worker;
and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always,
rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race.”

PSALM 8 *Your glory is chanted above the heavens. (Ps. 8:2)*

O LORD our Lord,

**you whose glory is chanted above the heavens out of the mouths of infants and children;

When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers,
the moon and the stars you have set in their courses,

SECOND READING Romans 5:1-5

Paul describes the life of faith with reference to God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. Even now, we have peace with God through Jesus, and our hope for the future is grounded in the love of God that we experience through Christ's Holy Spirit.

A reading from Romans:

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.




