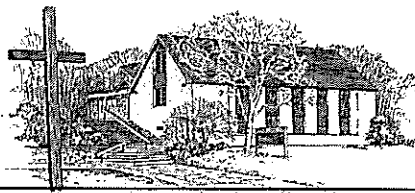

LITURGICAL ART NOTES

Twenty-third Sunday after Pentecost

In the Old Testament reading from Malachi, the fiery destruction of evil is followed by the rising of the **"Sun of Righteousness"** who will rise with healing in his wings. In symbolic imagery, the Sun of Righteousness is Jesus Christ who will rise again as the sun rises each morning and sends out the rays that free us from our sins and brings us a day of healing, forgiveness, joy and peace. According to **Martin Luther**, the rays of the sun are the words of the Gospel that penetrate the heart and shine day and night by the Holy Spirit. In the ancient Mesopotamian religion, the **sun god Samash** depicted the overcoming of darkness and death and the prophet Malachi, in an example of cultural adaptation, appropriated the image of the sun when referring to the coming promise of the God of Israel. Jesus is compared to the sun many times in the Bible and he is the **Orient** from on high and **Dayspring** from on high referred to by **Zechariah** in his canticle when the forerunner **John the Baptist** was born .

FIRST READING Malachi 4:1-2a

Malachi, whose name means “my messenger,” warns that “the day is coming.” On that day, the evil will be destroyed like stubble in a fire, but the “sun of righteousness” will shine on those who honor God.

¹See, the day is coming, burning like an oven, when all the arrogant and all evildoers will be stubble; the day that comes shall burn them up, says the LORD of hosts, so that it will leave them neither root nor branch. ^{2a}But for you who revere my name the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings.

SECOND READING 2 Thessalonians 3:6-13

Some members of the Thessalonian community, because of their belief in the nearness of Christ's return, had ceased to work, living off the generosity of other members of the community. The writer of this letter warns them bluntly that if they want to eat, they need to work.

⁶Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. ⁷For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were

with you, ⁸and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labor we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. ⁹This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. ¹⁰For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. ¹¹For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. ¹²Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. ¹³Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

opportunity to testify. ¹⁴So make up your minds not to prepare your defense in advance; ¹⁵for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. ¹⁶You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. ¹⁷You will be hated by all because of my name. ¹⁸But not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹By your endurance you will gain your souls.”


